

LEARN TO SAIL

We will be starting Learn to sail classes in the spring. The classes are very popular with members, as we had a full season last year certifying more members to sail the club boat. If you are an experienced sailor, you can take a test run with one of our volunteer instructors to get certified.

The fee for the Learn to Sail Program is \$350. 1 day in class instruction and 6 half days on the water. When complete, the member or auxiliary member will be able to rent the club boat.
