

The History of Fayerweather Yacht Club

After researching all available past minutes of club meetings and interviewing veteran members. Bob Kranyik and Leonard Kunin have written a history of the Fayerweather Yacht Club.

This History will be printed in, THE FOGHORN in monthly installments.

By 1936 the Fayerweather Yacht Club was prospering in a modest way. There were lockers in the shed and a meeting room upstairs. There was a float for tying up skiffs and a sandy beach where an old marine rail-way still led down to the water.

The railway was a handy place for hauling boats. An old apply tree stood nearby affording welcome shade to the men who often gathered under its branches to talk about boats, fishing and events of the day.

The old apple tree served also as a "Dead Man" to which tackle could be fastened for hauling boats up the marine railway on a bed of planks and rollers.

This practice was eventually forbidden because of several injuries incurred in cranking the windless.
