
ARTICLE XIII

Section 1. As currently written:

Section 1. Applicants for membership must have at least attained the age of 18 years. The amount of the initiation fee plus applicable taxes shall be that contained in the annual budget as approved by the membership at the November general meeting. One half (50%) of this fee plus applicable taxes shall be payable as an application fee. The balance of said fee, along with dues and any other charges, which may apply, shall be paid within thirty (30) days of notification to the applicant of election to membership. Application for membership must be in writing to the Financial Secretary, accompanied by the application fee; such application to bear the signature of two (2) members in good standing. The Financial Secretary shall forthwith cause the name of such applicant to be posted in the lub for a period of 10 days prior to a meeting of the Board of Governors. Upon receipt of an application for membership, the Financial Secretary shall forward forthwith the full particulars of such application to the Chairman of the Membership Committee. It shall be the privilege of any member to appear before the Membership committee and state his objections to the election of any applicant. Upon receipt of the report from the Membership Committee, the club shall proceed to take action on any applicant properly brought before the meeting by ballot and five (5) black balls shall reject the applicant.

This section will now read

Section 1. Applicants for membership must have at least attained the age of 18 years. Applicants 18 years to 21 years old will be eligible for Junior Membership. To attract and retain membership in this category, the initiation fees, dues, assessments and chit book amounts, may be set at reduced amounts from those set for Membership. On January 1st of the year following the Junior Member's 21st birthday, the member will be automatically reclassified as a Member. The Junior Member will have all membership privileges except they will have no voting rights. Also, the State of Connecticut statutes, including but not limited to, the "Liquor Laws", will apply. The Junior Membership time will apply to continuous membership years. Any current Member, meeting the above Junior Member age requirements, can be re-classified as a Junior Member. This will require written notification to the Financial Secretary and be effective the following January 1st. For all Member and Junior Member applicants, the amount of the applicable initiation fee plus associated taxes shall be that contained in the annual budget, as approved by the membership at the November general meeting. One half (50%) of the initiation fee plus taxes shall be payable as an application fee. The balance of said fee, along with dues and any other charges that may apply, shall be paid within thirty (30) days of notification to the applicant of election to membership. Application for membership must be in writing to the Financial Secretary, accompanied by the application fee; such application to bear the signature of two (2) members in good standing. The Financial Secretary shall forthwith cause the name of such applicant to be posted in the club, for a period of 10 days, prior to a meeting of the Board of Governors. Upon receipt of an application for membership, the Financial Secretary shall forward forthwith the full particulars of such application to the Chairman of the Membership Committee. It shall be the privilege of any member to appear before the Membership committee and state their objections to the election of any applicant. Upon receipt of the report from the Membership Committee, the club shall proceed to take action on any applicant properly brought before the meeting by ballot and five (5) black balls shall reject the applicant.



ARTICLE XIII

Section 2. As currently written:

Section 2. The number of dues paying members shall be limited to seven hundred (700). New applicants shall be limited to residents of the State of Connecticut.

This section will now read:

Section 2. The number of dues paying members shall be limited to seven hundred (700).



ARTICLE XIII.

Section 3. As currently written:

Section 3. In the event of unforeseen circumstances, it may be advantageous to temporarily the initiation fee amount. This requires approval of the membership at a regular monthly meeting following formal notification in the Foghorn.

This section will now read:

Section 3. In the event of unforeseen circumstances, it may be advantageous to temporarily modify, or suspend, the initiation fee amount. This requires approval of the membership at a regular monthly meeting following formal notification in the Foghorn.



ARTICLE XV Section 2.

Section 2. As currently written:

Section 2. Any member in good standing, after twenty-five (25) years of continuous membership, will automatically be granted life membership. Also, any member in good standing, after twenty (20) years of continuous membership and having attained the age of 65 years, may file for life membership with the Board of Governors. Also, any member in good standing, after fifteen (15) years of continuous membership and retired, may file for life membership with the Board of Governors.

This section will now read:

Section 2. Full Life Membership. Any member in good standing, after twenty-five (25) years of continuous membership, will automatically be granted Full Life Membership.

Early Life Membership. Any member in good standing, after twenty (20) years of continuous membership and having reached the age of 65 years, may file for Early Life Membership with the Board of Governors.

Also, any member in good standing, who joined the club on or before April 1st 1999, having reached the age of 65 years, after fifteen (15) years of continuous membership and retired, may file for Early Life Membership with the Board of Governors.



ARTICLE XV

Section 3. As currently written:

Section 3. Life membership shall include all club privileges with dues, assessments, and chit book obligations remitted. Life members shall have no voting privileges on matters concerning chit books, dues, assessments, and club expenditures, except as covered in Section 4.

This section will now read:

Section 3. Clause a). Full Life Membership shall include all club privileges with dues and assessments remitted. A fee may be imposed to cover the costs of servicing the membership. This amount of this fee shall not exceed 20% of the current annual Member dues amount. Chit books may also be required. Full Life Members shall have no voting privileges on financial matters other than those relating to the service fees and chit books.

Clause b), Early Life Membership shall include all club privileges with dues remitted. Assessments and fees to cover the costs of serving the membership may be imposed. The same fee limitation as Clause a), shall apply. Upon reaching twenty-five (25) years of continuous membership, the Early Life Member will be granted Full Life Membership. Early Life Members shall have no voting privileges on financial matters other than those relating to the service fees, assessments and chit books.

Clause c). Full Life and Early Life Members who are permanently residing outside of Connecticut, will not be subject to the chit book requirement.

Clause d). Inactive Life Member Status. A Full Life Or Early Life Member can elect to be placed in an Inactive Status. This will require written notification to the Financial Secretary. Also, a Full Life or Early Life Member who is delinquent in payment of financial obligations, will automatically be placed in Inactive Status.

The Inactive Status Member would not receive any club services, including mailings except for notices as shown in Article XVI Sect.1, but also, would not be subject to the service fees, chit books or assessments. Upon request to the Board of Governors, and the payment of the applicable fees, etc, the Inactive Status Life Member can be returned to active status. No fees, etc. will be retroactively applied for the period of the Inactive Membership. A person using fee based club services cannot claim Inactive Status. The Inactive Status will count as continuous membership.

Clause e). Special Circumstances. A person with special circumstances can apply to the Board of Governors, for an exception to the above rules. It is expected that these rules will be applied in a fair, reasonable and compassionate manner. It is not the intent of the Article XV Sect. 3 rules, to cause the arbitrary loss of membership.
