Sailing Update

The summer sailing season has finally arrived. This year we have change our sailing format to eliminate the double day races and we will now utilize the "time on time" PHRF handicap system. the "time on time" system will aid yachts with higher PHRF ratings, especially in light wind conditions. The Championship fleet will be divided into two divisions as in the past years. The Spinnaker division and Non Spinnaker division Championship series will begin on June 6. This years Black Rock YC/Fayerweather YC Regatta will be held on June 19th and 20th.

Fleet Captain's Corner

This will advise all who have any gear in the locker room, in the stalls where there are many small masts for winter racing, that it is the long range plan to "deck over" this area. It is part of the long range plan to extend the upper floor of the locker room and build a door on the SouthEast end of the building, in order to put the masts in from that end rather than do as we do now, have to go all the way around the building and enter from the parking lot end. We must have the gear removed in the next 60 days. Failure to do so will mean that the owners are turning these over to the club to do as the Board of Governors directs. The final date will be August 1, 1999. Some of this gear has been there for years and is totally unidentifiable...if you own any of this gear or know someone who does, please note the final date, and take steps to have it removed.

Also in this same plan, will be the renovation and moving of the dink racks, to better facilitate the access to the dinks and to raise the masts to the new SouthEast entry door more easily.

The fire-fighting seminar given by the Bpt Firefighters under the direction of Deputy Harbormaster Paul Cipolla was certainly well received if not too well attended. Of the 300 or so boats we have in our harbor, it would certainly have warranted more than the 30 people who showed interest enough to attend. We have requested of Paul that he give this talk and demonstration again next year, and if there is sufficient interest, we could even do it again this year...perhaps mid-summer. There is no question but that those who shot off their flares, were surprised at the distance these can travel. Every boat-owner should have the experience at least once, to get a feel for the power and velocity of these flares. The hand-held flares were also demonstrated and tested and now is the time to update all your flares...after three years most of them are out of date.

Coming up: the Tuesday Morning Breakfast Bashes, for which Frank has suggested we all come for breakfast and then go out and race. We can then return in time for lunch and the Club Kitchen will do twice as well...not a bad idea.

Wednesday night racing has begun.

The Shelter Island cruise is to leave August 7, and the customary meeting beforehand will be announced next month, as soon as we can clear the date with the Club Calender Guru.
