FLEET CAPTAIN'S CORNER.....12/99

The seminar schedule for this winter has been assembled and will be posted in the January Foghorn...compiled and edited by Bob Kranyik, in his usual prolific and professional style. We will have copies available in the box on the sailing board for your further perusal and to enable you to establish your schedule accordingly. From what we have seen thusfar, the topics should be most interesting and educational.

The moorings are out and there are a couple of problems...not every one has his name thereon and in the Spring, someone will be the loser. Because of this and to prevent it from occuring again, if there is not proper identification on the mooring, it will not be put in. Additionally, every ball must have a bolt or shackle placed just below the ball, to prevent the chain from coming up thru the ball, when we go to lift it. This puts much additional strain on the ball, and punctures it rendering it less than water-tight.

The Harbor Master Rules call for the name of each person and the weight of the mushroom on the ball...we like to have "FYC" on it as well in order to identify the mushroom as ours and not that of Black Rock YC.

There are two or three masts in the loft that require identification...this should be accomplished now so that Dave Riordan can properly bill each person. One easy way we have been using is to put our name on a white bucket and tie it to the end of the mast closest to the loft doors. This protects the light and instruments at the mast-head and makes Dave's job simple. Please do it now.
