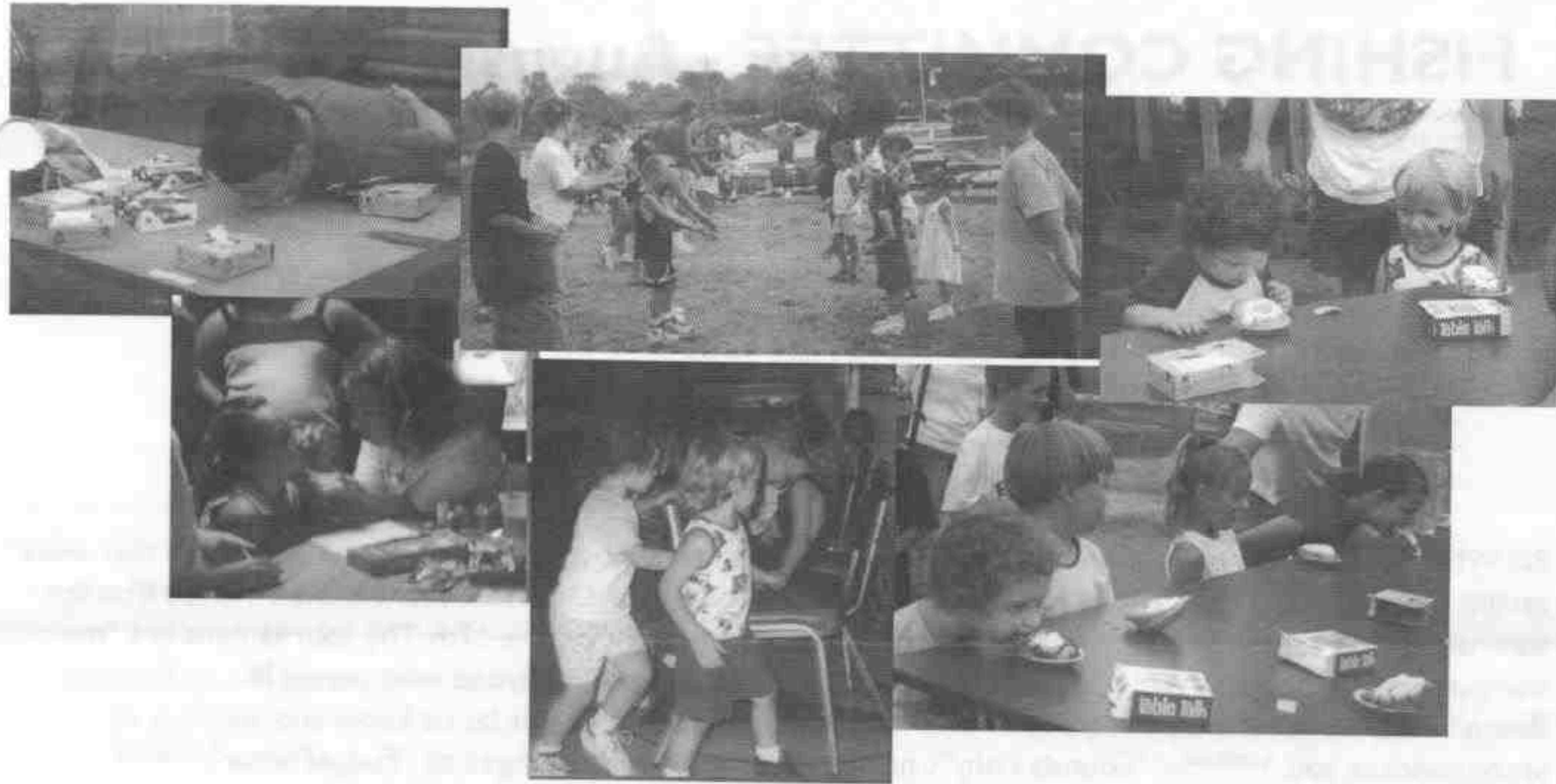

The Shelter Island trip was a success with a total of thirteen boats and among them some new faces. Jim Anderson did the trip solo on Seadog as did Jay Eugster and Al Namian on Paradiddle.

Meeting us later at Shelter Island were Ted and Judy Andre (Windfall) and Ed Morrison (Mimi), Frank and Mary Ellen Thompson (Mary Ellen 11). Highlight of the trip to Dering Harbor was the arrival of Arcadia with Chris Blossom and Pat with two young but well-seasoned sailors Travers and Ian, fresh from the sail down from Maine, and just prior to that, a lengthy sail from the Bahamas to Maine, via Maryland and other southern points. Great!

Tuesday morning races well-attended and we are up to 9 boats on average.

The trip to Northport is scheduled for Sept 21,22 and 23. Oyster Bay is a bit too far for the limited days involved and Northport is an easier and more accessible target. Also the anchoring is a good deal simpler.

Sailing Update September

We have had great weather thus far for this sailing season. Dave Riordan in his Flyer Quality Time won the Port Jefferson weekend with a third place in the Saturday race and a first place in the return race on Sunday. The Saturday race (a single leg close reach to the PJ bell) was won by Jack and Kathy Locher in their Tarten 3800 Das Bear. The return race was lead by Water Wolf (Ed Lobo) up to the outer Bridgeport channel mark (BH). Quality Time avoided the numerous holes along the way to the finish line at "2A" and easily took the first place.

Race number four in the Spinnaker division was taken by Water Wolf by two minutes over Quality Time. Renegade sailed by Christian McNeil took the first place in the Non-Spinnaker division.

Ray Hannan in Fianna lead the fleet around all marks in race five of the Spinnaker division. The wind was a brisk 10-12 knots for this race. Renegade took the first place in the Non-Spinnaker division.

The sixth race of the season was again sailed in a nice 10-12 knot northerly breeze. Special Sauce skippered by Tom Bobbin took first place honors in the Spinnaker class for her third bullet of the season . Sounder skippered by Oliver Bartine took a first place in the Non-Spinnaker division.

The totals for the season are shown in the chart below. Special Sauce has a two point lead in the Spinnaker division over Quality Time. The Tarten Ten Renegade has a 3.4 point leads over Oliver Bartine's Cal 27 Sounder. With still four races to go, anything can happen.
