SAILING COMMITTEE -SAILING UPDATE

The double day race of September 10 was held in a variable 7-12 knot breeze. Race number seven of the series (first of the day) was taken by Dave Riordan in Quality Time in Division I, while Ed Lobo in Water Wolf took a first in Race number eight. Bob Kranyik in Silver Heels won both races in Division H, thus clinching a first place for the season. Bob Butler in his Saber 34 whisper won the first race in the "Fun Fleet" and Terry Roach in Spook, a Coronado 25 won the second race of the day in the "Fun Fleet".

The stage was now set for the last race of the Championship series. Quality Time and Water Wolf were in contention for the championship of Division I. Fianna could move into second place with a victory coupled with a finish of fourth or worse for Water Wolf. Fourth place in the series was up for grabs between Hot Chocolate, Loose Cannon, or Renegade. The ninth and final race started in 20-25 knots of breeze that actually increased through-out the day to up to 30 Knots. Only four Division I boats came to the starting line for this race. Fianna easily took a first by 4 minutes. Quality Time and Water Wolf were neck and neck to the finish with Quality Time taking the second place by 25 seconds. Quality Time therefore wins The Division I championship for the year 2000. Silver Heels wins Division II, and whisper wins the "Fun Fleet". See the attached chart for the year 2000 summary.

The final race of the season is the Ken Johnson Memorial race, which will be held on Saturday October 7, 2000. (Rain Date is Oct 8)

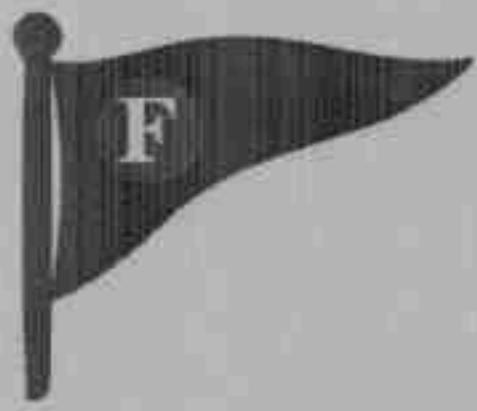
