The course will remain as usual....around R2 at Middleground and back to the finish between 2A and Black Rock #4. Starts at ten or close to it.

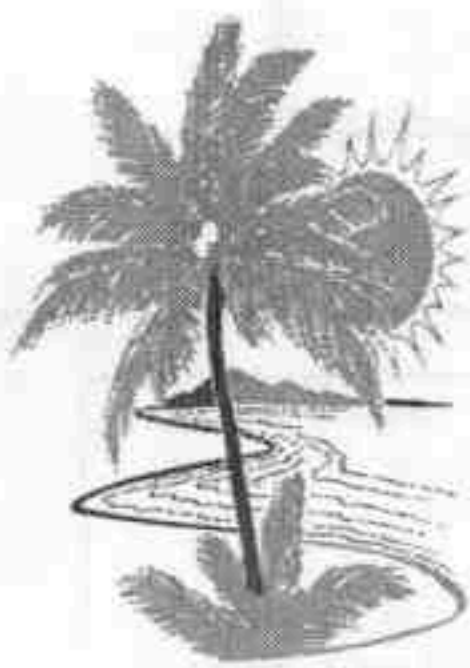

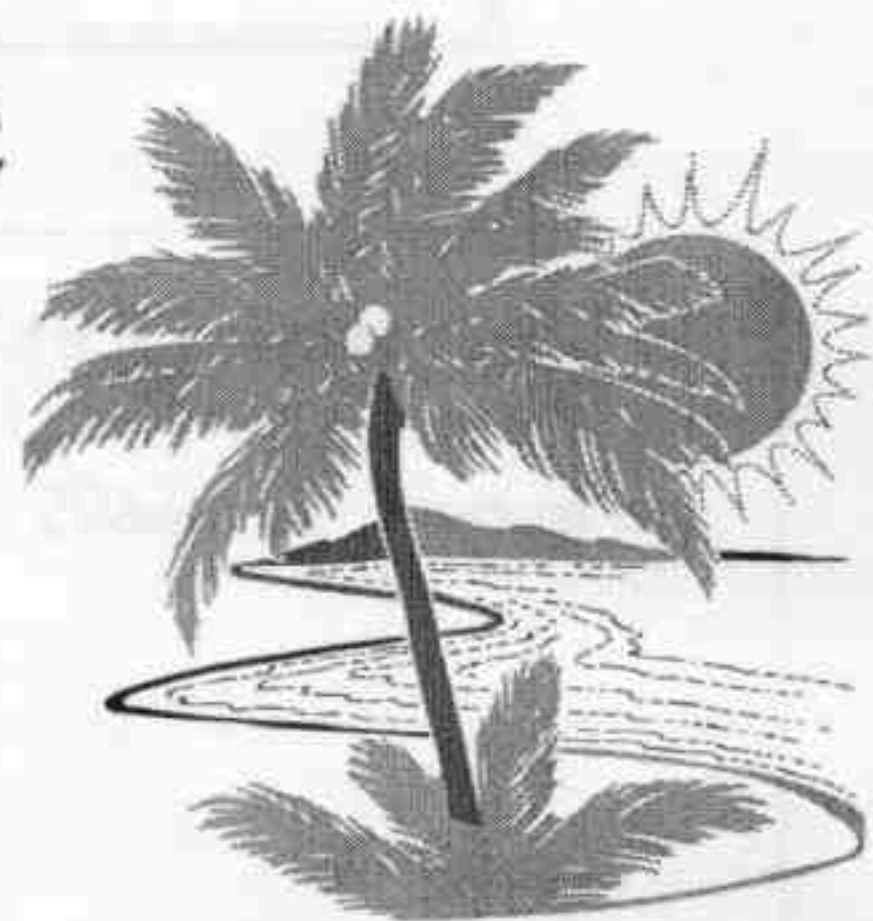
