As is always the case, the final race is not who comes in first, but who crosses the finish line last! The #1 horse, Grommet, would be the recipient of this honor, piloted by Terry Sekelsky.

Sailing Update

The summer sailing season is not to far off. This year the FYC Championship series will begin on Sunday, June 4, 2000. Entrants will automatically qualify when they send in an entry form with a check for \$75.00 for the "Race Class" (Div. I), or \$60.00 for the "Cruising Class" (Div. II), and complete one day of Race Committee -assignment. This year we are introducing the "Fun Class". This "Fun Class" will not have an entry fee, trophies, or race Committee duty. This class will be listed as Division III and will be scored the same as the other Divisions.

<u>Division</u>	<u>Description</u>	<u>Entry Fee</u>
I	Either Spinnaker or Non-Spinnaker Yachts designed for racing. Races will be Windward-Leeward courses	\$75
II	Either Spinnaker or Non-Spinnaker Yachts designed for cruising. Races will be triangle courses.	\$60
III	Non-Spinnaker Yachts only. This class is for first time participants and will be triangle courses.	no fee

The scoring will be based on PHRF "Time on Time". This will allow boats with higher PHRF numbers to be more competitive. The standard PHRF allowance will be given to yachts that race Non-Spinnaker. The final scores for all divisions will be based on the best six races.

The entry fee includes the Single-Handed race, the Port Jefferson Race Weekend, and the Ken Johnson Memorial Race. Please call Ed Lobo at home (203) 734-1163 or at work (203) 333-0161 ext. 5237 if you need more information. Entry forms are available at the sailing bulletin board.

The boating year approaches and we would ask that you cut out this section for suitable posting on your refrigerator. There may be some changes or additions, but essentially this is the schedule as we now see it.....

- The Tuesday Morning Races begin.....June 6**
- First Middleground Race.....June 24**
- Narragansett Cruise (Opsail 2000 included).....July 11**
- Second Middleground Race.....July 22**
- Shelter Island Cruise.....August 12**
- Middleground Race Number Three.....August 26**
- Middleground Race Number Four.....Sept 16**
- Middleground Race Number Five.....Oct 7**

SOMETHING NEW HAS BEEN ADDED: The Fun Fleet will be started on the first day that the regular racing schedule does and will continue to the end of the year as noted in the schedule put out by Ed Lobo and posted on the sailing board at the Club. Starts will be plus or minus one o'clock on ten Sundays, and the Cruising Class will also participate, with or without Spinnakers as the option appeals to you. These races will be close to four hours depending on wind and sea conditions. The important thing here is to join us, whether you come out for just one of the Sundays or each time the schedule calls for a race. You now have three types of classes and certainly this should make it easy to decide, first of all to RACE AT ALL, and then into which category you wish to enter.

As we get closer to Opening Day, more details will be developed and posted on the Sailing Board at the Club.

Moorings are going in after proper inspection by Harbormaster. Many have had to replace chain due to the past summers' onslaught on chain integrity by acid, electrolysis and galvanic action. Be certain you have the bolt underneath the ball as we have mentioned before and your name as well...this is critical as the moorings will not go in till these two have been accomplished. 'FYC' altho not required, is recommended, in case your ball or tallboy slip away...that way there is at least a small chance it will be returned to you. 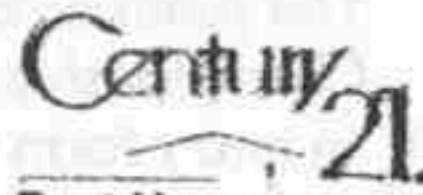
