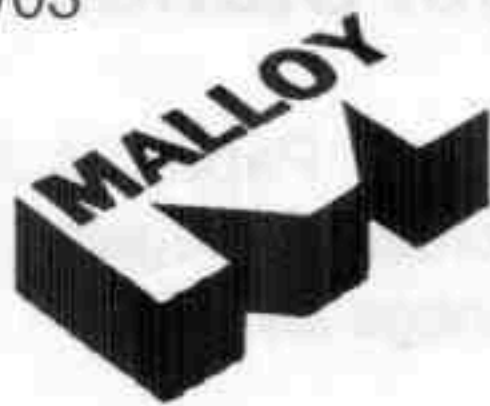
FLEET CAPTAIN'S CORNER

The Tuesday morning races have been going well...last few times we have had more than ten boats each race...we hope to keep this building as we proceed thru the summer...all are welcome. The cruise to Block Island was a large success...we had eight boats finally, although not all arrived together. The weather was cooperative with only one bad day when tide, wind and sea were all against us. Not bad though considering... The first Middleground Race of July 20 drew eight boats and the next one of August 24 should be even better...a simple race with no complicated rules...all are invited...no fee and the only requirement is a boat and show up at ten for the start. Incidentally, we are experiencing the best block ice that we have had in years...solid and black, the kind that lasts much longer than the frost stuff we used to get...we thank whomever is responsible for this improvement.

We remind all members that the dock rules are for all members...on week-ends and holidays, no more than twenty minutes at the dock. The Red Book is now in effect wherein all who stay at the dock overnight are recorded and payment is due and payable when the boat is left on the dock and not the next morning...this book is in the tender shack and all who use our dock are expected to see the dock person on duty and pay in advance. We are recommending that a supply of dock rules be kept in the tender shack and passed out to all who use the dock. Next is the famous Shelter Island Cruise...we leave on Saturday August 10, at about nine AM. Ports of call will be: North Cove Sat...Coecles Harbor Sun...Three-Mile Harbor Mon...Tuesday we go to Sag and pick up stuff for our lunch-raftup at noon or so, at West Neck, which is only an hour or so from Sag Harbor...we can no longer anchor at Sag and thus have had to make other arrangements...this turns out to be a more viable deal anyway as it brings everyone close together. We stay the night at West Neck and Wed night we will be in Dering Harbor...Thursday we are in Essex...Friday is the Thimbles and Saturday home. After Dering, there are one or two different possibilities and we will outline those alternatives at the PRE-CRUISE MEETING OF AUGUST 2...AT 7:30. At this meeting we will go over the plan of the cruise and get a general feeling from those planning to do the cruise, as to what they would like to do over and above what we have outlined here.
