## Swim across The Sound Sailing Regatta Update

It's almost here! Saturday July 19 is the date of the Fourth Annual Swim Across The Sound Sailing Regatta. In previous years, we've enjoyed good weather on the day of The Regatta, so hopefully this year's monsoon season will have reached its conclusion by race day.

There are four clubs co-presenting The Regatta this year: FYC, Black Rock, Cedar Point and Housatonic. Regatta organizers are expecting a large turnout, with many partici-

pating boats from the other clubs. The fantastic new club dock will certainly make it easier to accommodate a big guest fleet, although there may be some crowding between 1000 and 1130, as boats in The Regatta arrive and depart. If you're not sailing in The Regatta, please make plans to refuel your boat, or take on passengers, at an earlier or later time to avoid congestion at the dock.

As in past Swim Regattas, there will be only one race for each fleet, in order to get everyone backto FYC in time for the picnic and awards presentation at 1600. There will be multiple starts (for the PHRF spinnaker and non-spinnaker boats, as well as separate starts for boats like Catalina 30's, J/24's, Ideal 18's or any other class represented by three or more boats.) If you sail one of these popular boats, be sure to tell your friends who own the same type of boat that they should enter The Regatta. Race Committee Chairman Earl DeWitt, ably assisted by Rob Stephan from BRYC, is prepared to start as many classes as are entered. Earl and Rob will, as at every past Swim Regatta, be assisted in scoring and preparing boat photos and award plaques by Ed Lobo and Dave Riordan.

If you've known about The Regatta, but have not entered in previous years because you thought it was just for hardcore racers, you should know that this is one of most low-key, and FUN, sailing events on the Sound! Naturally, all of the yacht racing rules apply, but because the focus of The Regatta is to support a worthy cause (and to have a great time!), sportsmanship is paramount, and protests are discouraged. (and when Earl discourages protests, they tend not to happen!)

Let's not forget the Fun Sail. This increasingly popular segment of The Regatta is in the capable hands of Jay Jost, who promises that this year's event will be more fun than ever. Sailors will be navigating around a course, and collecting clues posted on each mark. These clues will then be used to solve a puzzle. If you'd otherwise be going for a sail with family and friends on the 19th, why not sign up for the Fun Sail, and help raise funds to provide free mammography screenings in Fairfield County? The \$100 entry fee is tax-deductible, so you'll need a very good reason not to sail in this year's Regatta! There are some great pieces of maritime art that will be raffled off at the Regatta picnic, donated by artists Chris Blossom, Bob Ledoux and John Schreck. Bob will also be displaying his creations at the picnic, and has kindly offered to donate a generous percentage of his sales to The Regatta.


