The oldest predicted log race on Long Island Sound will be held August 15, 2004. The Bishop Cup Race is sponsored by five Bridgeport yacht clubs. Boats 19 feet and over, sail or power, are invited to race.

For those of you who are not familiar, before Loran and GPS, Henry A. Bishop started this race as a teaching tool to improve navigational skills. basically to aid captains in getting to know their boats intimately. This is a race against your own time. You predict the time between the legs of the race taking into consideration wind, time, tide and speed. Remember the hare and the tortoise? The fastest boat is not necessarily the winner. Basically, the captain who comes the closest to his/her predicted time, WINS. Experienced captains at FYC will be available to help time boats for accurate speed and guide you with the calculations for predicting time.

Sign up! It's not only a great day on the Sound, but you will meet terrific boaters from the local clubs, and just maybe, bring the Bishop Cup back to FYC. Sign-up sheets will be at the club August 1st.




