FLEET CAPTAIN'S CORNER

There are certain items in this best of all possible worlds, that require reinforcement every so often, not the least of which are the following:

No masts are to be stored on boats which are left in our North Yard...there are two in violation right now, even though the owners have been notified as of at least a month ago...see our January Foghorn.

Masts are not to be left near the mooring area...there are four in violation. Unfortunately we do not have the identities of two of the four. These masts are to be removed and put in loft storage or taken away. Any question on this, call Dave Riordan...and incidentally, there has been more than one suggestion that these be stored in the South Yard...in pieces. Anyone who has one of these masts should call me or Dave so that arrangements may be made to resolve this issue.

We have put a new lock on what is referred to as the "Vendors" gate...it is now openable by a standard club key...and what is critically important, this gate is NOT to be left open and unlocked. Please see to it with the same amount of attention as in the case of our other gates, that this gate is kept closed and locked.

We have completed the end of year tallies for both dock and hoist income...by dock income we mean those dollars taken in for overnight stay only, not for gas or other sources. The hoist did reasonably well, even though it was out of operation for a large portion of the active summer months. We will give the final amounts for them at the February general meeting. There are two members who have outstanding debts. The Board of Governors is taking action and should resolve this deficit shortly.

We will be having our annual Shelter Island breakfast. The date will be Saturday, March 13, 2204, at 0900. This will be a buffet...the charge will be six dollars per person, regardless of age. The menu will be posted in the March Foghorn and there should be something to please the taste of everyone. All are invited whether you have been on the cruise or not. This is a nice thing to have at the club...a way to continue the camaraderii of members and friends. As usual we ask that you bring any photos, old or new (and that applies to your friends as well).

Finally, a thank you and well done to all who came to vote on our annual election day. Thank you to all the officers who served so well last term and are not returning. We look forward to the coming season...it's under 90 days til we uncover
