## Using the Docks at FYC

Members are reminded that according to the rules, the main dock exists primarily to provide all boating members with the opportunity to load and unload their boats, access to the Club launch, obtain fuel, perform short term activities such as boat cleaning, awaiting hauling, and tie up in cases of breakdown (one free night permitted). Normally, boats should not be tied to the main dock for more that 20 mintues except by permission of the dock person in charge. Longer stays depend on such factors as boat traffic, weather, special events, etc. When you tie up to the main dock, please inform the dock person on duty as to your intentions, and how you may be contacted if you need to move your boat.

Boats staying overnight should normally be tied to the transient dock, which also serves as FYC's guest dock. Tie-up to the transient dock is limited to seven days by Bridgeport Harbor Commission rules, Dock personnel must be notified, and payment made in advance.

Boat owners wishing to stay for long periods at the main dock must clear with the dock person in charge. If you are refused permission to stay at the main dock, such as during a

Fun Sail Chairman Jay Jost has again prepared an 11-mile "Fun" course, which will involve easy navigation around government marks. If the winds fade, Jay says Fun Sailors are permitted to use their "Iron Jenny" (This was a blessing last year!) 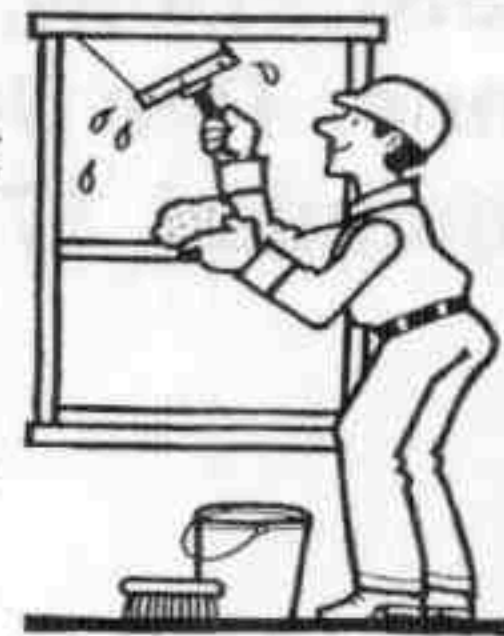

## **FLEET CAPTAIN'S CORNER**

**CRUISES THIS YEAR: BLOCK ISLAND TRIP...**leaves around 0900 on Saturday July 10...scheduled ports of call will be: Duck Island Rhodes or North Cove at the Ct. River. The next day, we will run thru Fishers Island Sound or The Race, and straightaway to Block. Stay at Block Sunday night, all day Monday and on Tuesday or Wednesday morning, leave to wend our way home via Shelter Island or Ct River and Essex, as suits our individual pleasures. Our preference is to stay at Block for the summer but we will probably leave Wednesday morning. Join us if you can.

**SHELTER ISLAND TRIP:** We will leave the Club on Saturday August 14 and make our way to Duck Island or North Cove at the Ct. River. Some may elect to go straight to Coecles Harbor on Saturday...we have done this in the past and find it a reasonable trip. Stay at Coecles Sunday and wait for the other to arrive...Monday we sail over to Three Mile Harbor about five miles away, and go in for replenishment of needed supplies. We go out to dinner at Three Mile. On Tuesday it's to Sag Harbor. Go into town for whatever is planned to cook that afternoon at West Neck, where we will have our customary raft-up. Stay at West Neck Tuesday and on Wednesday morning, leave for Dering Harbor by going South around Shelter Island. Good swimming at Dering and Greenport is only a short ferry ride away. Thursday night we will be in Essex, Coecles or Hamburg Cove. We did this Hamburg Cove thing last year and all boarded one boat to take us to dinner at The Griswold...nice thing to do. Friday night we sometimes stay at Thimble Islands and then it's an easy Saturday morning to home. There is no set schedule for the trip home and again weather and personal time constraints dictate.

We will have a meeting at the Club, prior to the SHELTER TRIP. We will answer any questions at that time. The date for this meeting will be Wed August 4th...I still have to confirm that there is no conflict with this date, but it generally is in order. The time is 7:30 and hopefully this will be OK.

### **THE HENRY A. BISHOP PREDICTED LOG RACE AUGUST 15, 2004**

The oldest predicted log race on Long Island Sound will be held August 15, 2004. The Bishop Cup Race is sponsored by five Bridgeport yacht clubs. Boats 19 feet and over, sail or power, are invited to race.


For those of you who are not familiar, before Loran and GPS, Henry A. Bishop started this race as a teaching tool to improve navigational skills . basically to aid captains in getting to know their boats intimately. This is a race against your own time. You predict the time between the legs of the race taking into consideration wind, tide and speed. Remember the hare and the tortoise? The fastest boat is not necessarily the winner. Basically, the captain who comes the closest to his/her predicted time, WINS. Experienced captains at FYC will be available to help time boats for accurate speed and guide you with the calculations for predicting time.

Sign up! It's not only a great day on the Sound, but you will meet terrific boaters from the local clubs, and just maybe, bring the Bishop Cup back to FYC
