



FYC RAINGUTTER REGATTA Saturday, April 18th, 2009

SAILING INSTRUCTIONS

Rules:

The Raingutter Regatta is similar to the Pinewood Derby except that the models are miniature sail boats. Although the seas are only 10-foot lengths of raingutter filled with water, and the ships a mere 6 to 7 inches long, the race is a very exciting event. Each person builds his or her own boat, or purchases and modifies a ready-to-go kit. Each person also provides the wind for the sail with his/her own lung power (straws will be provided for each participant).

Eligibility:

Open to ALL MEMBERS AND GUESTS - NO SAILING SKILLS NEEDED!!!!

Please come down and support FYC Sailing.

Instructions:

Regatta boat kits are available on-line at www.raingutter-regatta.com, and has a pre-shaped balsa hull, metal keel and plastic sail. The hulls are sanded and shaped, and are colorfully painted. Hull and sail can then be decorated and personalized to your liking. The boats race in pairs on raingutter courses propelled by the participants blowing into the sails.

For those who choose to build their own entry, below are the simple specifications:

Hull: No longer than 7" or shorter than 6 1/2"

Mast: 6 1/2" from deck to top

Keel: Open, no restrictions

Rudder: Open, no restrictions

Sail: Open, no restrictions

Classes:

3 class: Classic Mono-hull (wood hull), Catamaran (wood hull), Open (all other materials)
Racing will take place in pairs. Round-robin, elimination style. Relay races with teams of 4 will
be run following the individual classes, lifejackets are required!

Courses & Course will be a pair of 10-foot industrial PVC piping on mahogany bases. Racing will take Racing Area: place in the vicinity of the FYC main 'dance floor'.

Awards:

Awards will be presented to 1st, 2nd, and 3rd Place finishers in each division immediately following the tournament.

Entries:

Just show up with your boat model entry (or borrow someone's) and sign up that night.

A 'boat-building party' will take place at 4pm on the day of the event.
