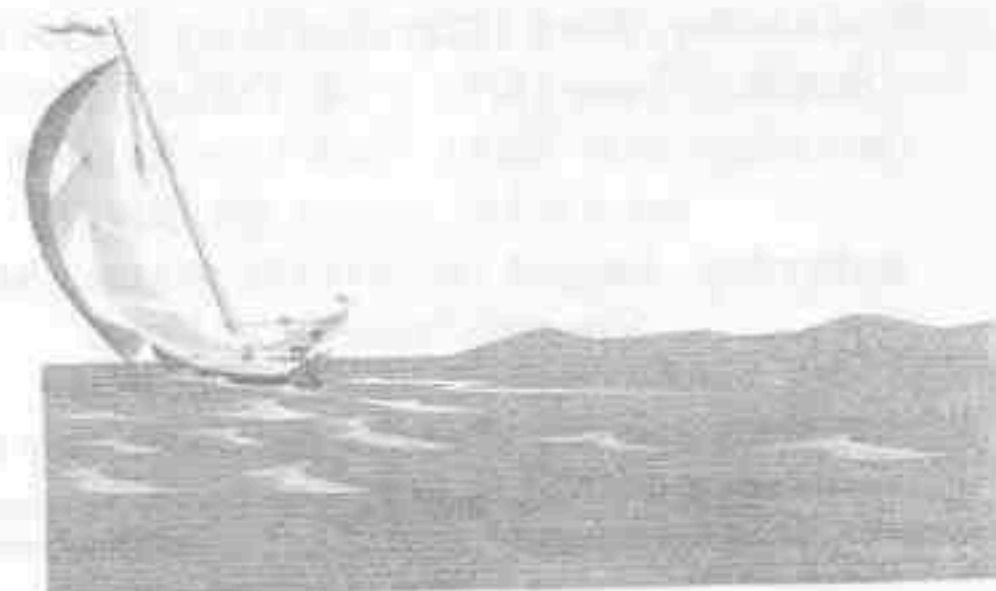

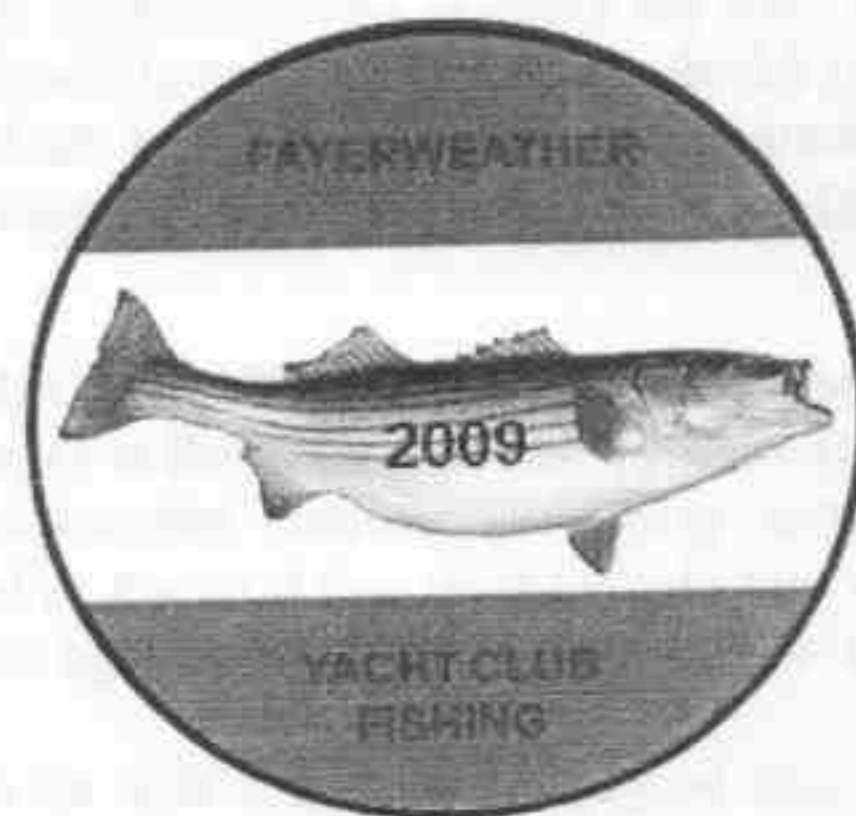

10:00 a.m. Memorial Ceremony begins at the Gas Dock area of the Marina

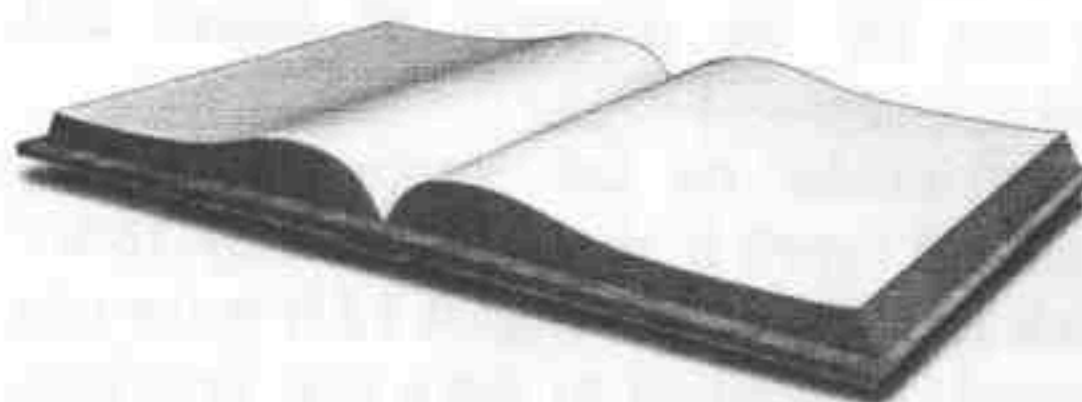
