

Terry, Bob Butler and Robert Kranyik brought the boat over to FYC to ascertain the extent of the damage. The rudder was bent. Chris Ruskay at Fayerweather Boat Yard donated his time to straighten the rudder. The bottom of the boat was scratched but otherwise intact. This remarkable group spent countless hours repairing and repainting the bottom, reinstalling the rudder until the boat was usable again. Much equipment was lost when the boat went on the rocks. Many other individuals now stepped in to donate and replace the lost items. In no particular order Bruce Moore, Lars Christensen, Lynn Sullivan, Don Worth, Robert Kranyik, Terry Roach and I raided our nautical stores to fully equip the boat. Many others will probably have contributed as of the writing of this article. To all of those involved, a hearty Thank You for your generosity and concern. This is truly the heart of Fayerweather.

The Bishop Cup, the oldest predicted log race in the country (a race where a captain predicts the time it will take to cover a specific distance), once again came back to Fayer-weather. My congratulations go out to Richard Parker, our Powerboat Chair, for accomplishing this feat.


