


FAYERWEATHER YACHT CLUB COOKBOOK

Bishop Cup Race-Sat, Aug 20th

RING THE BELLS!

No, it's not Christmas - but yes, you can ring the bells! That is, bells 2 and 10. Don't ring them with a hammer, but with a clap (clapper) as you go by them timing your boat for the Bishop Cup Race. The distance between them is 1.68 Nautical miles.

Load your boat similar to the way you'll have it on race day - fuel and friends. Set your tach, get up to speed, and run mark to mark. Try to use a stopwatch. When you pass the second mark, maintain your speed, and make a wide turn, still maintaining your speed, and go mark to mark again. Now that you have your two times, use these to figure your time to run the course, which will be posted at the club on Aug 14th, the same day race packets will be available.

If you need help in figuring your time, call me and I will get you expert help. But remember, run the marks and get the two times. From there we move forward. Remember, this is a race that will test your navigational skills, and how well you know your boat. It is a test of time and distance, not of power.

If you plan on running the race, you must - repeat must - call me, as there is new info that you need to know. Also, remember that you must bring an observer to exchange. All you need is a compass, a tach, and an engine. A sail boat with these three things and no sail is a powerboat. We've had some sailboats from FYC enter in the past. And all of you who keep your boats at town or private marinas, it's your Club to, not just a place to get gas. It would be a boast to win the race. This is the 1st race of the 2nd century for the Cup.

And it's being run from our Club - home water advantage!

Last thing - if anyone would like to donate a prize, it would be appreciated.


The race is Saturday, August 20th, and of reasonable distance.
