

August 17th South Norwalk Boat Club will host their annual hot dog cookout.


August 24th we have been invited to Port 5.



This month we will divert to our fun summer attractions:

Block Island trip:

Depart FYC on July 8, 2017. Ports of call will be: North Cove on the Connecticut River Saturday night. Second day, we depart and should reach Block plus or minus 1500 hours. We will stay at Block Sunday night, Monday night and Tuesday night. On Wednesday, we will counsel with all the participating captains as to the following days ports of call.
