A reminder about signing guests in. Members ARE responsible for their guests make sure each square is completely filled in per CT state liquor law. Members need to PRINT their names, not sign. We were doing better about a month ago and we've slipped as we've entered our busy season. If a state liquor agent cannot identify the name of the member signing in guests or spaces are left blank, we can be fined.

We had a very successful Sunday afternoon with jazz on the deck on July 15th. Life Member Brian Butler brought his quartet down to play and about 35 members and guests enjoyed the music till 3 PM. Stay tuned for more Sunday afternoon musical events when we do not have a regular event scheduled. We will also be having music on the deck on some Saturdays. St. Vincent's Medical Center Foundation, a charitable organization, is hosting the 31st Annual SWIM Across the Sound Marathon on Saturday, August 4, 2018 and are in need of volunteers to help ensure swimmers have a safe trip from Port Jefferson, NY to Bridgeport, CT. This Marathon will raise about \$400,000 and provides cancer screening and preventive education not covered by insurance, and funds other needs including the purchase of wigs, prostheses, medication assistance, free transportation to treatment and appointments, day-care scholarships, support groups and more.

The success of the SWIM Marathon depends on the generosity of local boat owners to escort swimmers as they cross the Sound. Power and sailboats, 22 feet and longer, are needed as escorts for solo, two-person and relay teams, as well as to serve as perimeter guide boats and safety backup. This year we need 120 boats for what is shaping up to be a record number of swimmers. Boat captains who are interested in volunteering can register here.

Registered Captains are welcome to a free slip beginning at 12 noon on Friday, August 3 in Port Jefferson, NY and are invited to attend a SWIM Foundation-Sponsored Party at the Marina that evening. On Saturday, August 4th at 7 am, boats will need to be in place at Danford's Marina for the kick-off of the SWIM Marathon where a continental breakfast will be served for volunteers. The 15.5-mile race begins in Port Jefferson and will end at Captain's Cove Seaport in Black Rock Harbor, Bridgeport, CT where there will be an award ceremony and banquet. Overnight slips will be available at Captain's Cove Seaport for Saturday night. There will be a meeting for first-time Connecticut-based captains on July 24 at St. Vincent's Hospital, a meeting on July 25 at Danford's Hotel for Long-Island-based captains and a dinner meeting July 31 at Vazzy's Four Seasons in Stratford, CT for ALL Captains and Their Crew.

Fleet Captain's Corner:

My daughter, Mary, wrote to the USCG relative our difficult and obviously lengthy ordeal sailing from Block Island to our Club... I would hope that our members would fine this educational in content and appreciative in purpose...Bob Butler

To: Katherine E. Minor, US Coast Guard Dear Katherine –

I once heard that it is never too late to say "thank you." It is in that spirit that I write to you today on behalf of the Whisper crew and our families

As you know, we left Block Island on x-date as a disabled vessel in that our engine was not running. We had made it to Block without incident, only to find the starter had failed when we went to start the engine the afternoon we had arrived. While we had waited until July 7th for a new starter, the one sent to the BI marine mechanic was not the correct part. With medications dwindling for my Dad and brother and with work requirements looming, we called got towed out of Great Salt Pond in order to sail home. We left Block at about 9 AM. Given my Dad has been sailing to/from Block for 60 years and as a family who grew up sailing, we felt confident as we set sail.

Hours into our journey, our electronics failed and the wind started to decrease. We trimmed our sails and continued. At about 10 PM when air had really abated, we called BoatUS to inquire about a tow home. As it turns out, the premium coverage for which our Dad had paid only allows for a tow within 25 miles of home. We had quite a distance to go. The BoatUS rep called the USCG to inquire about assistance, and you nicely reached out to us directly.

You asked all of the right questions about who was on the boat, whether we were safe, condition of our vessel, etc. You asked questions about our Dad and brother Brian as they have cardiac meds and diabetes. While you offered a tow into New Haven harbor, Dad respectfully declined as we were worried if weather would be cooperative the next morning. My Dad, nearly 89 years of age, and my brother Brian are both seasoned sailors. They said we would push through and sail for home. You generously offered to set comms on an hourly basis.

Katherine, it was SO nice of you to connect with us each hour. Using our phones, we had a compass. We gave you our longitude and latitude each hour, and you helped us understand where we were located and how far we had traveled. I can't tell you how good it felt to have you there for us. We knew you would call us each hour and/or we could call you if we had a change in circumstance along the way. You were our beacon of hope, security and safety. My sister Martha and I breathed a sigh of relief (as did our families) knowing the US Coast Guard was monitoring our progress.

As we approached Stratford Point, we didn't have any air and were bobbing like a cork in the water. We called our brother Barry who said he would use his sailboat to motor out and tow us into Fayerweather. It was pitch black. We had trouble finding each other. We called you with Barry's coordinates and our own, and you told us he was one mile away (SW, I think) from us. We called Barry to give him direction and within minutes, he saw our masthead light and found his way to us. We were so excited and relieved! I can only imagine how much more time we would have wasted if we didn't have your help.

We can't thank you enough for your professionalism, expertise, calm demeanor, emotional intelligence, and leadership. You are an asset to the USCG. Every time we tell the story, you and and the assistance you provided us are a big part of it.

these boards are for adult use only.


REMINDER: The FYC dart league has started, but all members are welcome to join at any time no matter what experience or ability and the dart games begin each Monday at 7pm.
