## Fleet Captain's Corner

This month's entry will be somewhat off the grid in that I would like to point out to all our members who own boats, a new procedure..for those of you who cover their vessels in the customary (and always expensive) manner...I have used this methodology for sometime now and find that it not only works well but is much less costly. As Terry would say: " Here we go."

I purchase a piece of shrink-wrap from our friends at Fayerweather Boat Yard...this is 20 by 40 feet in as much as our vessel is 34 feet overall...I put a ridgepole from bowrail to sternrail...over this, I place the 20 by 40 section of shrink-wrap...every four feet or so, down at the waterline level I tie a tennis ball or baseball...I leave the line which is used to tie on the ball, at least eighteen inches long...I then tie the loop of this line to a point on my trailer...that's it...the 'down-tying' line keeps the cover from flying up like a spinnaker...the boat also stays dry due to the quality of the shrink-wrap. As to the ridgepole, you can make one from any combination of two by threes...these are, of course re-useable year after year. Even in the event that the shrink-wrap lasts only two years, you are still 'way ahead in adopting this method.



Return visit to Northport By Bill Selski, PC S/V Journey

Once again, we return to Northport Harbor. It is a 20.6 nautical mile (23.7 statute mile) 3 hour and 45 minute trip. Calm seas and no wind each way. Yes, we have a sailboat but the engine gets us where we want to go.

We arrived at Centerport Yacht Club (CYC) for a mooring for three nights. The past two years we had scheduled for three but stayed only two. Weather was a factor each of those years. One trip was a delayed start and the other an early return. Time spent at CYC includes launch service to access the club and also shuttle to the village of Northport. The competition size pool was very welcoming this year as the 90-degree heat and humidity was intense. The mooring fee is \$60 per night, cash or check. The club bar and restaurant





does accept credit cards.

This year with the extra day in port we were able to walk the mile to the Vanderbilt Mansion and Museum. The summer cottage, *Eagle's Nest*, of William K. Vanderbilt II. Through the years, the cottage had become quite the mansion. The tour takes you through the mansion and the museum rooms of aquatic life and land animals.

Sitting on the boat is relaxing and we bring along our reading material. This trip I chose to reminisce about 1969. Sure, it is 50 years since Woodstock or the man on the moon but I wanted to read Art Shamsky's account of the World Champion Mets, *After the Miracle*. After all many players did live on Long Island.

We usually like to eat dinner one night in port and this time we chose The Ritz Café, a local Italian place with plentiful portions. After dinner a Beatles

tribute band played on the Green while we strolled through and then listen even when we got back to our boat. Our final night in the harbor included one heck of a storm passing through. Lightning was all around as the hills around the harbor was being hit with strikes. Fortunately our mast was not the tallest in the harbor.
