### Fleet Captain's Corner:

It has long been our custom to present to this column the cruising itinerary for the coming summer. Since this has been working nicely for eons, there is no reason to alter the system at this point.

Most of our vessels will be defrocked soon now that the warm weather is just around the corner. Our plan is to layout to the folks just what dates we have developed for the coming cruises. Based on the best possible currents leaving Black Rock Harbor, we conclude the following:

**Block Island Cruise:** Departs Black Rock on July 7<sup>th</sup>, 2019. The tide is favorable at a very early time, but that cannot be helped...I cringe when I write the time of flood tide: 0230 hours. While I recognize that this is a most ungodly hour, those of us that choose to leave at 0530 will have a nice positive flow assisting as we move easterly. Actual departure time is, of course, at each captain's option. Those that leave at 0800 or so, although the current will be against them for some five hours, can anticipate having a nice positive flow later in the day.

**Shelter Island Cruise:** Departs Black Rock on August 10<sup>th</sup>, 2019. The tide becomes favorable at 0800 hours...much improvement over that for Block. This is the one cruise that has the option of making it to Coecles Harbor in one day or two. The trip to Coecles normally takes nine to ten hours if indeed you elect the option of going straight through. The alternative is much easier on the ladies: stop at North Cove up the Connecticut River. The moorings are free and the surrounding area is green with vegetation and the skies filled with wonderful sea birds. As Terry would have said: "Your Call"

Prior to each departure date, by plus or minus ten days, we will have the customary pre-cruise meeting at the Club to determine what boats, with what crews will attend each respective cruise. I like to have this data to present to the Coast Guard for each cruise.

Also in the early weeks of May, we will have our usual " Coffee 'An " and go over all the myriad details of the summer sailing including both cruises.

As to the moorings: Please make certain that your mooring ball has the following: Your name...weight of mushroom...and " FYC " thereon ... Boat name could be a good additional as well.




### **"REDISCOVERING FYC"** LOOKING BACK 100 YEARS

Walking around Fayerweather there is so much history. I would like to share with you what I have found in an article each month.

### Fayerweather Bell:

In 1980 Dr. Ivan Justinius donated the original Black Rock School bell



to our club. The 150 pound cast bell can be found mounted close to the Tenders shed. On Opening Day the bell is rung by the Auxiliary to remember the past years deceased members. With each name read the Auxiliary throws a flower into the harbor. It is very touching!

# Fayerweather's Historic Bell

In his detailed diary of late 18<sup>th</sup> and early 19<sup>th</sup> century life in Black Rock, William Wheeler writes that on February 17, 1831, "Black Rock votes \$300 for a schoolhouse and \$40 for ground to set the same on". And ten years later on October 15, 1841, he notes "new schoolhouse building (Black Rock)". The ground referred to by Wheeler is the present intersection of Brewster St. and Grovers Ave. and the "new schoolhouse" was a two-story building with a belfry serving Black Rock children from grades one through eight and replacing a one-room schoolhouse.

The belfry, situated above the front gable of the building, was considered a "status symbol" for 19<sup>th</sup> century schoolhouses and was equipped with a bell which called the students to school. Consisting of two floors, this schoolhouse also would have provided separate rooms for younger and older children. Lasting until the early 20<sup>th</sup> century, when the new Black Rock School which exists today was built, this building was subsequently torn down and lost forever to the generations that followed.

However, some years ago, the bell that once tolled the students to school was donated to Fayerweather Yacht Club by Dr. Ivan Justinius, author of The History of Black Rock which was published in 1955. This treasure from the past is the only known article from this schoolhouse that exists today now secured to a post below our deck. It continues to be rung "officially" once a year and a small plaque sits above it with the following inscription:

### First Black Rock School Bell Donated By Dr. Ivan Justinius

In 2019, as Fayerweather Yacht Club celebrates its centennial and Black Rock commemorates its 375<sup>th</sup> anniversary, both by embracing the past as a meaningful part of the present, our club is fortunate to hold such an important piece of Black Rock's history. And when this bell is rung on Opening Day to call our mariners back to the sea for another year of yachting, we'll be hearing the same sound that called Black Rock's students to school nearly 200 years ago, a sound of history that continues to echo through the centuries.
