Thanks also to those of you who remember to bus your own table when finished. This saves time for the bar staff who then must sanitize the table and chairs before the next seating and makes your table available that much sooner for those who may be waiting. Please also remember to provide your credit card or chit card at the time you place your order, as this also helps to expedite things. Also, thanks for respecting the social distancing guidelines while at the club, and I kindly ask that you not move chairs from another table in order to seat more than six people at your own table.

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
Auxiliary Corner

In the meantime, I hope to see you at the Club enjoying it with the new rules as they re-open.



Crewing opportunities (with coaching if needed) will be available as well.



Attention Boaters - Important:

Cleaning up the Moorings and Dink(s) Racks in the Hoist area.

Moorings If you have a mooring in the hoist area you have until August 1st, 2020 to claim it. After that, those moorings which can't be identified will be removed from FYC property and disposed of as per House Rules pertaining to: Yards and Dinghy Dock; Boats stored On Club Property item 2: 2. Any items left on Club property (including boats, moorings, gear or personal effects) after the storage period shall be assumed abandoned.

Dinks/kayaks: If you have a dink(s) in the storage area you have until August 1st, 2020 to claim your dink/kayak. You must also be in your spot and put your sticker on dink/kayak. There are a handful of dinks/kayaks that have been there for a few years with no sticker or name. If not claimed, they will be removed of FYC property per House Rules.

Dinghy Dock/Rack Regulations: 7. Any member shall only be entitled to one dinghy dock and one dinghy rack position.
